5. GENERAL PROGRESS

5.1 SADCMET WORKSHOP ON WATER TESTING PROFICIENCY SCHEME

During February 2004 the SADCMET secretariat, with the assistance and support of PTB organized a workshop on Water testing proficiency scheme for laboratories in the region, as a first step towards the establishment and implementation of the actual scheme.

The Workshop was attended by 40 delegates from member states, and two experts from Germany. Delegates proposed a model water testing PT scheme to initially focus on several parameters for Ground/drinking water, to be expanded at a later date to encompass waste water as well as microbiological aspects. Umgeni Water of Pietermaritzburg (South Africa) was chosen as the PT provider. The pilot PT scheme is scheduled to kick off at the beginning of August 2004, with seed funding from PTB and a nominal contribution of US\$ 100/round from each participating lab.

A SADCMET CD ROM with all the presented papers is available from the secretariat and the presentations can also be downloaded from the <u>SADCMET website</u>.

5.2 TRAINING COURSES

The following training courses were held over the review period:

- a) Mass/Volume: The course was attended by staff from Angola, Mozambique, Ethiopia, Lesotho, Swaziland and DRC. The training was held from 24 September to 3 October 2003 and focused on the following; mass calibrations (weights and balances); volumetric calibrations (volumetric and gravimetric); calculation of air density and buoyancy correction; unpacking and installing of equipment; pre-calibration procedures; and establishing the accuracy and sensitivity of equipment.
- b) Temperature: The course was held from 14 to 25 July 2003, with participants from member countries. The practical training was based on the equipment contained in the UNIDO funded mobile metrology lab and focused on liquid-in-glass thermometry; resistance thermometry; thermocouple thermometry, and temperature installations.
- c) Dimensional metrology: The course was held in the period 24 September to 3 July 2003, and covered the following aspects: calibration of dimensional measuring equipment, micrometers, vernier calipers, steel rules, electronic indicators etc).

5.3 AFRICA HOSTS INTERNATIONAL EXPERTS

The <u>Consultative Committee for Mass (CCM- Force)</u>, held its Force working group meeting at the National Metrology Laboratory of the CSIR during March 2004.

The meeting was attended by internationally recognised experts in the field of mechanical metrology from Asia, Australia, Africa, Europe and the Americas. Chaired by Prof. Manfred Peters of PTB, the meeting focused on activities related to the comparisons of force standards, harmonisation of international traceability and measurement.

5.4 SQAM AWARENESS SEMINAR IN LESOTHO

Preparations had been concluded for holding the meeting in Lesotho in November 2003, when the event was cancelled by the hosts at the last minute. Efforts are underway to schedule new dates and speakers.

5.5 SADCMET DELEGATE ATTENDS ARSO GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The Regional Coordinator attended the 12th General Assembly of African Regional Organisation for Standardisation (ARSO), held from 506 February 2004 in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. The GA was preceded by a Symposium on Standards and Market Access. The GA resolved that a new vision and role for ARSO needs to be defined so as to support and be in line with the African Union's NEPAD programme. SADCMET commented that ARSO's role should be more to coordinate sub-regional efforts encompassing southern Africa, west Africa and east Africa.

5.6 Mass Intercomparison:

The current round is scheduled to be completed by mid this year, and it is proposed that a Workshop be held for presentation and analysis of the results. TC 1 activity.
